

MINUTES REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF THE ALLEGHENY COUNTY SANITARY AUTHORITY THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 25, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 p.m. in the office of the Authority, 3300 Preble Avenue, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Those participating were Board Members: Mr. Corey O'Connor, Ms. Sylvia Wilson, Dr. Shannah Tharp-Gilliam, Mr. Jack Shea, Mr. John Weinstein and Mr. Harry Readshaw. Also participating were Mr. Max Junker (Babst Calland), Ms. Williams, Ms. Kennedy, Ms. Oliver, Ms. Clark, Ms. Fantoni, Messrs. Inks, Jackson and Vallarian (Authority staff).

Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

An Executive Session was held this afternoon at approximately 3:30 p.m. to discuss pending legal issues (*Note: votes are never taken during the Executive Session*).

Ms. Kim Kennedy, Director of Engineering and Construction, announced to the Board that Dan Lockard, Manager of Capital Project was awarded "Engineers' Society of Western Pennsylvania's 2020 ENGINEER OF THE YEAR. Dan Lockard has been with ALCOSAN for over 20 years. Arletta spoke of how proud she is of Dan and Kim showed a Power point presentation of the Honorary event.

Report of actions by the Executive Director in approval of construction change orders less than \$30,000.00 and a cumulative total change order value to date of less than five percent of the original contract amount

No. 2, under Contract 1716-G, "Main Pump Station Flow Meters and Access Platform" from Kokosing Construction, for the amount of \$13,685.00. This change order represents costs for additional demolition of Pump 4 pipe encasement and additional concrete coverage for exposed reinforced steel. The original amount of the contract was \$2,483,000.00. The current value of the contract including this change order is \$2,506,081.00.

A-2019-3008589 and A-2019-3008652. The agreement commits both DLC and ALCOSAN to share relevant project information related to the Crescent Transmission Line project and certain components of ALCOSAN's Clean Water Plan projects, where necessary for coordination. This agreement will be in a form approved by the solicitor.

Upon motion of Mr. Weinstein, seconded by Mr. Shea, the Board approved modification of the Grant Agreements for the Green Revitalization of our Waterway (GROW) Program by extending the Term of the Contract

Upon motion of Mr. Weinstein, seconded by Mr. Shea, the Board authorized the Executive Director to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Riverlife. The MOU is to provide for open communication between ALCOSAN and Riverlife as it relates to the West End Sewer and Trails upgrade project and the Clean Water Plan.

Upon motion of Mr. Weinstein, seconded by Mr. Shea, the Board Motion to authorize the Executive Director to enter into a Reimbursement Agreement with Lumen for the relocation of fiber optic lines located on Norfolk Southern (N/S) railroad property within the temporary construction easement granted by N/S to ALCOSAN. This relocation is required as part of the North End Plant Expansion project. This agreement will be in a form approved by the solicitor.

Jackson and Vallarian (Authority staff).

Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

An Executive Session was held this afternoon at approximately 3:30 p.m. to discuss pending legal issues (*Note: votes are never taken during the Executive Session*).

Ms. Kim Kennedy, Director of Engineering and Construction, provided a status report on the 2021 Capital Budget. She stated since her report in January the Authority has spent 5,000,000,000.00. 2.7 million was spent on the Plant Expansion, while almost 1 million was spent on Municipal Source Reduction Projects and existing interceptor systems.

Report of actions by the Executive Director in approval of construction change orders less than \$30,000.00 and a cumulative total change order value to date of less than five percent of the original contract amount

This cost is to replace ductile iron drop pipes with stainless steel, which is necessary to properly support the pipes with welded lugs. The original amount of the contract was \$14,866,150.00. The current value of the contract including this change order is \$14,891,416.41.

No.1, under Contract 1711, "Annual Interceptor Cleaning Contract," from Jet Jack Inc., for a time extension of 132 calendar days to complete the work. The time extension is needed for delays due to wet weather and Covid-19 restrictions. The original contract schedule was 213 days. The new contract completion schedule is 345 calendar days.

No. 2, under Contract 1667, "CIPP Rehabilitation for Portions of the Saw Mill Run and Allegheny Interceptors", from IPR Northeast, LLC for the amount of \$33,704.40. Higher than anticipated flows during the contract period required additional by-pass pumping. This change also includes a credit for removal of contract work at MH 54 and MH 34-2. The original amount of the contract was

\$6,909,621.00. The current value of the contract including this change order is \$6,943,325.40.

A RESOLUTION OF THE ALLEGHENY COUNTY SANITARY AUTHORITY, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, TO AMEND AND RESTATE THE AUTHORITY'S PRETREATMENT REGULATIONS TO MAINTAIN COMPLIANCE WITH EPA REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, pursuant to §5607(d) of the Pennsylvania Municipality Authorities Act, 53 Pa.C.S. §5607(d), the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority ("ALCOSAN") has the power to adopt reasonable rules and regulations necessary and convenient for the treatment of wastewater; and

WHEREAS, the ALCOSAN Board of Directors ("Board") adopted Pretreatment Regulations on or around September 14, 1984, as amended on or around April 21, 1999, as further amended and restated on February 25, 2010, and as further amended and restated on July 22, 2010 ("Existing Pretreatment Regulations"); and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") issued ALCOSAN's National Pollution Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") permit on December 22, 2018, as amended July 23, 2020, which required ALCOSAN to undertake a Headworks Analysis; and

WHEREAS, the EPA approved ALCOSAN's Headworks Analysis on December 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the NPDES permit requires ALCOSAN to revise the Existing Pretreatment Regulations within four months of the December 30, 2020 approval; and

WHEREAS, as required by 40 CFR 403.8(f)(5), ALCOSAN developed the Enforcement Response Plan ("ERP") for approval by the Board and to be incorporated by reference in ALCOSAN's pretreatment regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to amend and restate the Existing Pretreatment Regulations in accordance with the Amended Pretreatment Regulations set forth in Attachment "A" ("Amended Pretreatment Regulations") to address the comments and requests of the EPA and to maintain, preserve and protect the public health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board hereby resolves as follows, incorporating the above recitals by reference:

Section 1. The Existing Pretreatment Regulations are hereby amended and restated in their entirety as set forth in Attachment "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein. In addition, the Board hereby approves the ERP incorporated by reference in the Amended Pretreatment Regulations.

Section 2. All prior regulations and resolutions adopted by the Board are hereby repealed in whole or in part to the extent inconsistent herewith.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect in accordance with applicable law.


